IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT FROM **LARRY NAIMAN, TCPOA PRESIDENT:**

In November of last year, XCEL Energy contacted the TCPOA and wanted to know if we were interested in a project to install all of the overhead distribution electric lines within Timbercreek Canyon underground. These are the electric lines that supply electricity directly to our homes. Of course, we said yes after reassurance that there would be no direct cost to our residents. Each residence will be underground to your meter box, whether your service is now overhead or underground from an existing pole. Once the underground system is installed, the overhead lines and wood poles will be removed. Phase one will include everything south of the creek. Phase two will be north of the creek at some future date. **Please note the large steel pole Transmission lines will remain.**

Xcel is in the process of completing a similar project at Lake Tanglewood and Timbercreek will be next. They have not given us a scheduled start date, but when they do, there will be an announcement in the newsletter.

FROM TCC POLICE CHIEF



On February 11, John Vaught, Timbercreek Canyon Police Chief sent out the following email:

In the past 30 days we have had two dog bites occur within the Village. Both dog bites were the result of the dog not being restrained. Both the Texas Health and Safety Code and the Village Code of Ordinances mandate that dog owners are to keep their dogs restrained at all times.

- . Failure to restrain animals is a Class C Misdemeanor.***
- . Dog or cat bites will result in a 10-day quarantine of the animal.***
- . Failure to keep dogs and cats vaccinated for rabies is a Class C Misdemeanor.***
- . Dog bites resulting in serious bodily injury of a person is a 3rd Degree Felony.***
- . Dog bites resulting in the death of a person is a 2nd Degree Felony.***

If you are an animal owner, please ensure you are keeping your animals restrained at ALL times. Doing so will help protect your neighbors, yourself, and aid in preserving the peace enjoyed within Timbercreek Canyon.

FROM TCC FIRE CHIEF



Timbercreek Fire Chief, Eddie Wood, has requested that each adult resident print out this FILE OF LIFE FORM and the NEIGHBOR FORM and keep it posted where First Responders could easily find it in case of an emergency! Posting it on the front door or by your bedside is recommended. This could be the difference between life and death. It might be wise to save this form on your computer in case you need to update the information at a later date.

Also, in a community like Timbercreek Canyon, you should really get to know the people who live close to you. These are the people who can arrive quickly if you are having a crisis. The second form is a great way to keep their contact information easy to find if you are in a panic or flustered. These are such great tools.

BURN BAN ISSUED



From ABC News 7 Amarillo:

CANYON, Texas (KVII) — Randall County commissioners approved a burn ban Thursday.

That means no outdoor burning of any type until May 27, unless the ban is lifted.

Randall County has gotten virtually no rain for the last 30-days. According to the [US Drought Monitor](#), Randall County and most of the Texas panhandle is in a moderate drought.

We're also dealing with [record heat](#). Through Feb. 23, the average high temperature in Amarillo sits at 60.2 degrees, making the winter of 2025-26 the warmest on record so far.

And last week, we had four days of [red flag warnings](#) which means warm temperatures, very low humidity, and stronger winds are expected to combine to produce an increased risk of fire danger.
