EVERYTHING OLD IS NEW AGAIN

Here is a little history on Timbercreek Canyon from the Texas State Historical Association:

Timbercreek Canyon is in the upper Palo Duro Canyon northeast of Canyon in Randall County. The site was originally on the McAfee ranch. In 1971 the McAfees and W. C. Roberts planned development of the area with 501 lots. Before its incorporation, Timbercreek Canyon was under the extraterritorial jurisdiction of Amarillo. The community operated under a voluntary dues system to maintain roads and gates. Since this system did not bring enough money for the purpose, residents voted to incorporate in the summer of 1983. By that time Timbercreek Canyon had seventy-five homes, with at least six more under construction, and a population of 209. It included another development called Colony Catharine on the west. The community is a highly restricted area with security gates and deed restrictions. In 1985 it had a mayor, five aldermen, a marshall, and a volunteer fire department. Its mail came through Canyon. In 1988 the population of Timbercreek Canyon was 190. In 1990 it was 277. The population grew to 406 in 2000.

BUT.....before Timbercreek Canyon, there was Colony Catherine! I found the following online:

"Colony Catherine" primarily refers to an artist's colony in the Texas Panhandle founded in the 1960s, named after its co-founder, Catherine Buck. While there is no historical "colony" or settlement named Catherine in a broader sense, the name is also associated with Russian imperial history through Catherine the Great.

Colony Catherine

: The Texas artist colony

The most direct reference to "Colony Catherine" is a mid-century decorative arts center in Palo Duro Canyon, Texas.

- Founders: The artist colony was created by Robert McKenzie and Catherine Buck, who it was named after.
- Location: It was situated in a secluded area of Palo Duro Canyon, near present-day Amarillo.
- Purpose: It was a cooperative of artists with multiple studios, known for producing custom, hand-printed fabrics for interior designers.

- Architecture: The colony included several distinct buildings, including a "cliffhouse" designed by organic architect John Covert Watson.
- Legacy: The central studio structure has been demolished, but the canyon cliffhouse remains and is being restored. Some of the McKenzie silk-screened fabrics created there have been noted for their quality and unique style.

WELL.....The "Cliffhouse" has been bought & is currently being restored – or is it being updated – or......do you want to know?

Want to follow along? The new owners have started an Instagram page documenting the progress of what's happening at the "Cliffhouse"! (When we first moved to Timbercreek Canyon I nicknamed it the "Castle" so – if I call it that instead of the "Cliffhouse" you'll understand!)

HUMMINGBIRD MIGRATION

I saw this on Facebook, and while we are just on the edge of their migration route, it would be a good thing to make sure your hummingbird feeders are full, just in case!

HUMMINGBIRD HELP: Our Ruby-throated hummingbirds are heading back south on their annual fall migration. Please consider keeping the hummingbird feeders out and stocked with hummingbird nectar now through at least late October. One part white sugar and four parts water works! The most common and heaviest concentration of the Ruby-throated humming bird is zipping southward with the arrival of yet another cold front across the eastern United States.

The tiny hummingbird is incredible and can flap their wings up to 80 times per second with a heartbeat of over 1,260 per minute! That burns a lot of energy and requires calories and frequent feedings during peak migration into September. Hummingbirds can feed every 10-15 minutes and can consume up to 3 times their body weight in daily food as they migrate southward during the day.

If you've seen them hungry and at your feeders in great numbers recently, this is why! Keep them fed and spread the word. Safe travels as this migrations takes the next several weeks, see you again in the Spring! #nature #weather #birds #fblifestyle
